The Baldwin Library has both a modernist wing and a 1927 Tudor-style building. I believe that this project has resulted in the modernist wing becoming sleek, airy, and—well—modern. At the same time, the project has honored the 1927 building by restoring its original brick color and exposing windows that have long been covered.

Off the Grand Hall is the new Claudia E. Ireland Reading Room, named after a former president of the Friends of the Baldwin Public Library. The Library thanks the Friends for making a donation to the Library's building fund and thereby securing the naming rights for this space.

The theme of this year's summer reading program is BUILD A BETTER WORLD. That theme reflects both our recent building project and the Library's increasing emphasis on building and creativity. This summer's programs include a number of "make it" programs for young people. And our new Idea Lab—a "makerspace" featuring a 3-D printer, laser cutter, and robotics bench—will be available by August.

Of special note this summer is a series of programs commemorating the 50th anniversary of the 1967 Detroit Riot, as well as a talk on June 24 by Frances Stroh about her memoir Beer Money. Stroh's beer will be served at this event.
